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# 1. Please describe in light of the responsibilities of the RESNET Board why you are the right person to be a member of the RESNET Board of Directors

I believe that part of the boards responsibility, and specifically the responsibility of a board member representing Providers, is to understand the various size and business models while ensuring the integrity of the rating system. I also think that it is important to have representation on the board from a variety of business sizes and models of Provider organizations.
