RESNET's Whole House Water Efficiency Rating

What is HERSH20?

HERSH20 builds off of RESNET's nationally recognized Home Energy Rating System (HERS) Index to produce a whole house water efficiency rating for single-family and duplex homes by rating their indoor and outdoor water usage, including:

- Bathroom and kitchen
- Clothes and dishwasher
- Pools and irrigation

The score is calculated by comparing the rated home to a reference home, which is typical of construction practices in 2006. Applicable to both new and existing homes

Lower scores mean less water consumption

Average annual price escalation rate for water* is 4.1%

*Compared to a 2.8% annual price escalation rate for electricity
