1. Please describe in light of the responsibilities of the RESNET Board why you are the right person to be a member of the RESNET Board of Directors

I'm VP of Sustainability at KB Home – the first RESNET Energy Smart Builder. KB Home has built 135,000 ENERGY STAR certified homes, and 10,000 solar-powered homes.

I worked on the development of KB Home's Energy Performance Guide (EPG), which is based on the HERS Index. I established KB's standard of having every home inspected and rated by RESNET-accredited raters.

KB Home has also built 15,000 WaterSense labeled and WaterSmart certified homes. KB Home won EPA WaterSense awards for the past 9 years.

Educated as an architect, I have over 30 years of architectural technology and green building experience.

2. Why is this the right time for you to serve on the RESNET Board?

The HERS Index is more important to builders than ever before; it is now a factor in energy codes, and used in marketing new homes, particularly vs. resale homes.

Also water efficiency rating HERSH2O is almost ready for use. As a RESNET board member, I want to work on supporting the HERSH2O Index and RESNET's standards. Specifics include:

- HERSH2O software
- HERSH2O registry; QA; and training.
- Serve raters and builders in making cost-effective water efficiency choices.

3. Please explain your knowledge and/or experience in terms of each of the primary responsibilities of the RESNET Board

As mentioned, KB Home was the first RESNET Energy Smart Builder. I worked on the development of KB Home's Energy Performance Guide (EPG), which is based on the HERS Index. I established KB's standard of having every home inspected and rated by RESNET-accredited raters. Beyond energy efficiency, KB Home and I have developed a focus on water efficiency, which helped lead to the water efficiency initiative at RESNET -- HERSH2O.

- Promote the nexus between water efficiency and energy efficiency.
- I've participated in the development of RESNET's Water Efficiency Rating system from the very beginning of the program.
- I have the know-how to work with builders on use of HERSH2O to further differentiate new homes from existing, less water-efficient resale homes.

4. Describe your experience in either leadership and/or serving on the board of a non-profit organization.

As mentioned above, I currently serve on RESNET's Board of Directors. I also Chair the RENSET / ICC committee to develop the water efficiency rating standard.. In recent past, I served on the Board of Directors for EEBA, and as chairperson for the Urban Land Institute Sustainable Communities Council in Orange County, CA.

5. What would you contribute to the RESNET Board?

I would like to continue working on a couple of initiatives that have started in recent years:

- Further develop HERSH2O
- Work with RESNET and other stakeholders to bridge the gap between California's and the national Home Energy Rating System.
