

Results of Ballot of the RESNET Board Executive Committee on Extending the Emergency Authority to the RESNET Executive Director to Temporary Waive Provisions in Chapter 2 and 9 of the RESNET MINHERS Standards and Board Policy That Will Hinder the Rating Industry in Meeting the National Emergency

March 26, 2020

Current news is indicating that President Trump is considering lifting the COVID-19 national emergency by Easter of this year. It is clear that the pandemic will still be raging at that time and many states and local governments that issued emergency stay at home proclamations will be still in effect.

When the thirty days' time line after the lifting of the national emergency was adopted, it was not conceived that the President might lift the proclamation so soon.

While there may not be an official federal national emergency there will be a crisis still underway that will affect the HERS rating industry.

With this is mind, the RESNET Board Executive Committee conducted an electronic ballot on granting emergency authority to the RESNET Executive Director be increased to 60 days after the national emergency is lifted.

The following are the results of the electronic ballot:
